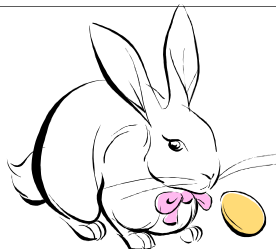

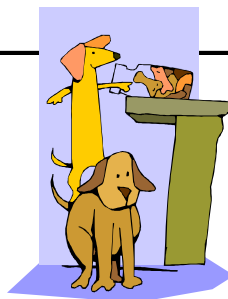

July 18th, Niles will celebrate the 11th annual Niles Dog Show, where the motto is “No pedigree? No problem!”

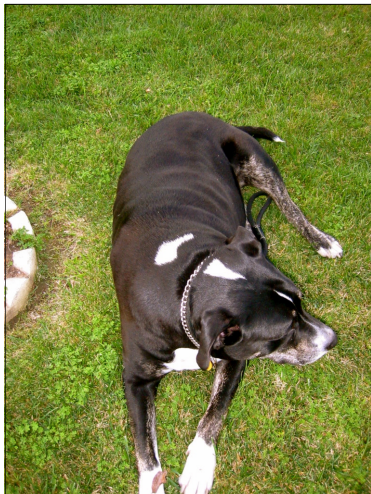

Breed of the Month...Great Dane

The Great Dane originates from Germany and was bred to be a guardian, hunting large game. His coat is smooth and short and can be brindle color, black masked-fawn, blue, black, harlequin or mantle. A male can be at least 30" tall and weigh 130-180 pounds, while a female can be 28" and 110-150 pounds.

Great Danes are gentle, loving, easygoing and sensitive. They are usually friendly toward other dogs and pets. Though powerful, they are sensitive and responsive to training.

Great Danes need daily moderate exercise. They need soft bedding and sufficient room to stretch out when sleeping. Some tend to drool. Coat care is minimal.

A Great Dane's life span is 7- 10 years.

GUIDE DOG VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Are you interested in learning about being a Guide Dog Puppy Raiser? Want to hear more? Randy & Chris are having weekly meetings at California School for the Blind in Fremont on Tuesday nights from 7:00-8:00p.m. teaching what it takes to voluntarily pay it forward. Help a blind person become more independent and be able to see the wonderful world we live in, through a puppy's eyes. Our puppies come from Guide Dogs for the Blind in San Rafael at about 8 to 10 weeks old. The puppies are Labrador retrievers (black or yellow) male or female of your choice. We train for about 1 year and then the puppies are recalled back to Guide Dogs for more extensive training. This is a very rewarding experience.
