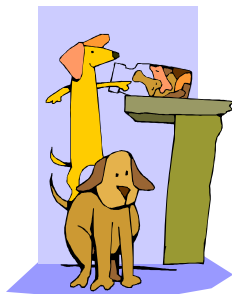

Labrador Retriever - Breed of the Month...

The Labrador Retriever originates in Canada. They are from Newfoundland, not Labrador. They were used for water retrieving and feature a short, straight and fairly hard coat. You may see Labs in colors from white to black, often known as yellow, chocolate and black. A female may be up to 23.5" tall and weigh 50-70 pounds, while a male can be 24.5" tall and weigh up to 90 pounds. Labradors remain the most popular breed in America. Labs need daily exercise, preferably retrieving and swimming as well mental exercise. They are eager to please and enjoy learning, but they can be hard-headed. Labs have a high energy level, demonstrate a high level of friendliness toward other pets and towards strangers. Hip and elbow dysplasia, and obesity are common health concerns for Labs.

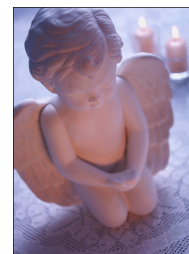
The life span of a healthy Lab is 10-12 years.

STRATHAM, N.H. (AP) — Call him the stray that won the day.
Chaplin, A stray 2-year-old black and white cat, beat out purebreds and other pampered felines to win top honors in a cat show in New Hampshire. The cat, currently awaiting adoption at an animal shelter, won "Best Household Pet" at the Cat Fanciers' Federation's regional show in Rochester on May 16.

Just five days earlier, Chaplin was a nameless stray referred to simply as "the cat" by the people who found him. When he came to the shelter in Stratham, the staff thought his desirable double paws and dashing good looks could put the Persians, Himalayans, and Scottish Folds to shame.

So far, Chaplin seems unfazed by his newfound fame.

Don't Put Your Pet In the Back of a Truck

It is very dangerous and in some states illegal, to drive with a dog in the back of a pick-up truck. Not only can flying debris cause serious injury, but a dog may be unintentionally thrown into traffic if the driver suddenly hits the brakes, swerves, or is hit by another car. Dogs should ride either in the cab (in a crate or wearing a seat belt harness designed for dogs) or in a secured crate in the bed of the truck.

GUIDE DOG VOLUNTEERS STILL NEEDED

Are you interested in learning about being a Guide Dog Puppy Raiser? Want to hear more? Randy & Chris are having weekly meetings at California School for the Blind in Fremont on Tuesday nights from 7:00-8:00p.m. teaching what it takes to voluntarily pay it forward. Help a blind person become more independent and be able to see the wonderful world we live in, through a puppy's eyes. Our puppies come from Guide Dogs for the Blind in San Rafael at about 8 to 10 weeks old. The puppies are Labrador retrievers (black or yellow) male or female of your choice. We train for about 1 year and then the puppies are recalled back to Guide Dogs for more extensive training. This is a very rewarding experience.
